Access through PRACE Peer-Review



Free-of-charge & required to complete final report & publish results at the end of the award period

Preparatory Access (*2, 6 or 12 months*)



Optional support from PRACE experts
Prepare proposals for Project Access



Project Access (*12, 24 or 36 months*)

Required to demonstrate technical feasibility of project



SHAPE Programme (*2 - 6 months*)

Aimed at SMEs wishing to adopt HPC

Scientific
Excellence**

Peer-Review Principles

- ✓ **Transparency**
- ✓ **Fairness**
- ✓ Avoiding **Conflict of Interests** at all phases of the process
- ✓ **Confidentiality**
- ✓ **Right to reply** at the different phases of the evaluations
- ✓ **Right to appeal** the final decision (addressing the BoD)



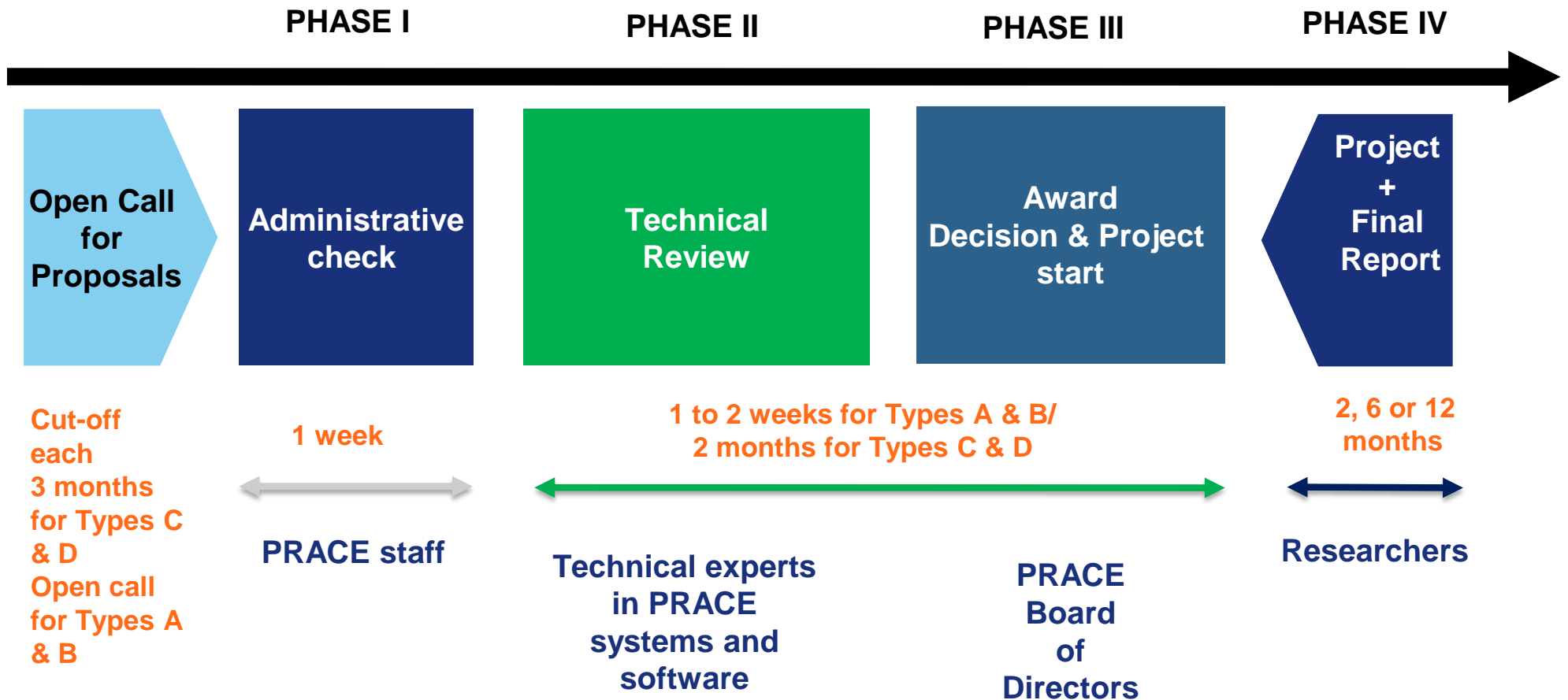

Preparatory Access

Proposals **limited** by:

- **amount of resources available** (Types A, B and C)
- **availability of experts support and type of expertise** (Type C and D)

Oversubscription of resources - awarded on a 1st-come, 1st-served basis to suitable proposals according to submission date, until the resources are exhausted.

Tentative calendar of next cut-off dates:

01/12/2017 > 11:00 AM CEST	(32nd cut-off)
01/03/2018 > 11:00 AM CEST	(33th cut-off)
01/06/2018 > 11:00 AM CEST	(34th cut-off)
01/09/2018 > 11:00 AM CEST	(35th cut-off)



Useful tips for Preparatory Access

- ❑ Include **all Team members** in the proposal (**extra user accounts may not be accepted by the HPC centre**)!
- ❑ **Check the Terms of Reference** and PRACE webpage on most updated information of resources available for the cut-off (call deadline)!

- ❑ Make sure you select the appropriate type of access for your needs!
- ❑ **Contact** PRACE Peer-Review Team and HPC centres during the preparation of proposal if necessary.



- Aimed at **SMEs** willing to adopt a new HPC-supported solution
- Based on following criteria:
 - ❖ Strength of business case (significant RoI expected)
 - ❖ Technical feasibility (resources sufficient to complete the project in 2-6 months)
 - ❖ Innovative aspects of proposed solution
 - ❖ Social and economic impact on society
- Up to 500,000 core hours on a PRACE system

Project Access

Calls for Proposals are published **twice/year**.

Applications **must** use codes:

- previously **tested**;
- **demonstrate high scalability & optimisation** to multi-core architectures;
- **demonstrate a requirement** for ensemble simulations that need a very large amount of CPU overall.

Proposals **administratively rejected do not continue to** the evaluation process.



Stages of Peer-Review Assessment / check

Administrative check (PRACE staff)

- 1) administratively accepted
- 2) administratively rejected

Technical assessment (Technical experts in PRACE systems and software)

- 1) Accepted
- 2) Rejected
- 3) Conditionally accepted

Scientific assessment (Independent experts in the field of research)

Comments and score between 1 and 6

Final ranking (*Prioritisation AC meeting*) lists the proposals in order of priority to provide resources during the allocation session (PRACE AC members, technical experts, PRACE staff).



Useful tips for Project Access

- ❑ Recommended after a Preparatory Access project (**reference in the application form**) on the same system to be used in Project Access.
- ❑ Read **carefully** the **Terms of Reference** and the **Technical guidelines documents**.

- ❑ **Respect** the **eligibility criteria** stated in the **Terms of Reference document**.
- ❑ **Respect** the **Online application form** and **Project scope and plan** document template and guidelines.
- ❑ Include **all Team members** expected to use the system.
- ❑ **Reply** to reviewers comments (respecting the limits/guidelines).
- ❑ **Contact** PRACE Peer-Review Team and HPC centres during the preparation of proposal if necessary.
